



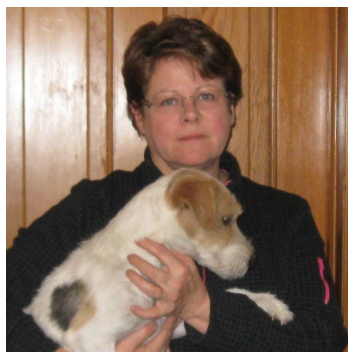

Any Jack Russell Terrier whose dam was registered or recorded with the JRTCC and owned by a permanent Canadian resident at the time of breeding. In the case of co-ownership where one or more of the dam's owners were non-Canadian residents, the owner whose kennel name the resulting offspring carry must have been a permanent Canadian resident at the time of breeding

***New* Family Class Definition**

For Family Class, Brood Bitches and Stud Dogs entered may not be spayed/neutered. The offspring at their sides may be intact or spayed/neutered

Mickey

Before you say, "That doesn't look like a Jack," I have to tell you that it isn't exactly. Mickey is a CoJack, a Jack Russell Terrier / Pembroke Welsh Corgi hybrid whom I rescued in January 2010. I confess I was a bit taken aback by his appearance when we first met (my kids still like to ask him, "Mickey, why the long face?"), but this little guy has personality to burn. Loyal and affectionate, all he wants to do is spend time with his loved ones, dividing his time between watching the world pass by our front window and teasing Suzie, my other JRT Rescue.

Mickey was apparently in a happy situation for 6 years before he came to me, even if he wasn't well socialized. His owner, a widower, apparently married someone who didn't want or couldn't keep dogs, and there Mickey's unhappy journey began. I was his fifth home in a year and it was heartbreaking to see his reactions to his new surroundings. On walkies he'd go running up every driveway in the neighbourhood looking for

his home; in the car he'd be bounding around looking for his house, or he'd see someone who looked like his old master and start barking madly, tearing around the car trying to get out. Now that Mickey has settled in I'm fond of saying that I hope no one ever makes the mistake of asking me to choose between them or my Jacks, or that would be a short friendship.

The CoJack is a mix of a great herding dog and all the things you'd expect in a Jack. Unfortunately, I can't always tell the difference between his "I want to play with the other dogs" excitement versus his natural-born-killer "I'm going to eat that Yorkie" side. This mix has a reputation for being gentle, kind and loving, which he certainly is at home, but there's a wild hunting side to him as well. One of his most endearing traits is the way he sits straight up on his haunches when he's excited and claps his front paws together, although his less-endearing trait is his tendency to pick on other small dogs, and more than once I've had to convince him to let go of the ear of another dog who made the mistake of trying to get acquainted.

Now this is what is it all about.....

Introduction to Quarry Overview

The dog is released approx 10 ft from the entrance to the earth. The dog has 60 seconds from the time of release to reach the quarry. The Den is 10 ft with one 90 degree turn. Once the dog has reached the quarry it must work continuously for 30 seconds. The dog is then retrieved from the earth.

Junior Earth Dog Overview

The dog is released approx 10 feet from the entrance to the earth. The dog has 30 seconds from the time of release to reach the quarry. The Den is 30 ft with three 90 degree turns. Once the dog has reached the quarry it must work continuously for 60 seconds The dog is then retrieved from the earth. 2 Legs are required to earn a N-JE

Senior Earth Dog Overview

The dog is released approximately 20 feet from the entrance to the earth. The dog has 90 seconds from the time of release to reach the quarry. The Den is 30 ft with 2 entrances, a false den and three 90 degree turns. Once the dog has reached the quarry it must work continuously for 90 seconds. Once the dog has completed the working portion of the test, the Judge seals the viewing area, removes the quarry and seals the quarry area. The Judge then instructs the handler to recall the dog from the den and the handler has 90 seconds to recall and retrieve the dog. 3 Legs are required to earn a N-SE

And now get ready to be impressed.....
